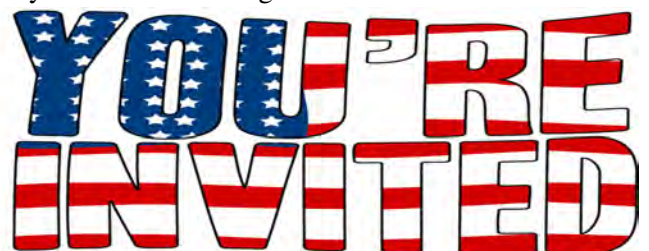
## Moose Legion

## MEMBERSHIP

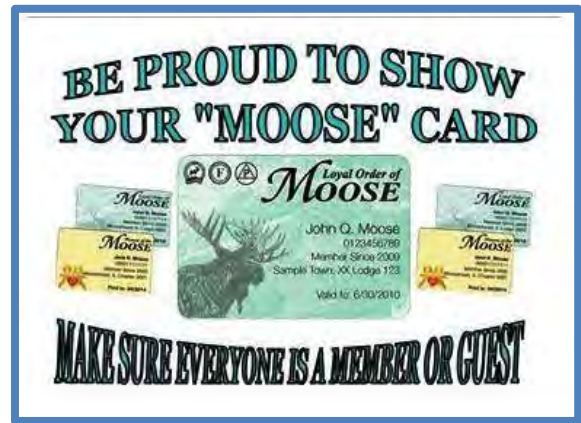

The convention consists of several days of meetings and reports about the various programs and activities that our fraternity supports. It is at this convention that the proposed changes to our by-laws will be discussed and voted upon. Finally, the new General Governor and officers are elected and installed. All this takes place every year at every convention.

I've been to several International Conventions over the years. My first convention was in Chicago in 2009. I went as part of the class for our Lodge Ritual Team. This upcoming convention will once again host a Lodge Ritual Competition. Many lodges throughout the fraternity have resurrected their Ritual Teams and have been working hard to bring that tradition back.
