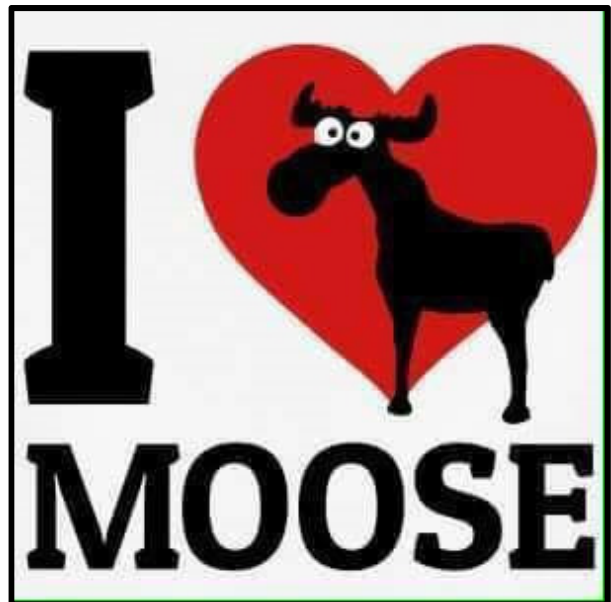
Moose Riders

MEMBERSHIP

A while back the Board of Officers made a change to the entertainment within the Lodge. Basically, the bands that are booked for Friday and Saturday are not always going to play on the smoking side of the Lodge. The original plan rotated the bands each weekend evening. This raised the ire of the smoking population of the membership as evidenced by the Facebook chatter and the increase in meeting attendance. The Board revised the new policy to return the bands to the smoking side of the Lodge except for the second and fourth Friday of each month.

This move has smoothed the feathers of some of the smokers but several still insist that the entertainment be strictly on the smoking side. It seems that their reasoning is that the non-smoking side of the lodge is usually much less populated than the smoking side. Frankly, they have a point. The Board of Officers has tried very hard to make the Lodge accommodating to those on both sides of the smoking issue. Yes, there is room for improvement of the space. Perhaps a bit more ambiance. But, if we as non-smokers, don't use the non-smoking space then how can we justify spending money to improving it?

I want everybody to enjoy the Lodge. Those of us who prefer the non-smoking side need to come back and make use of the privilege. The efforts put forward by past Boards and the current Board to encourage more use of this space are to be commended. Let's not waste those efforts. Our Lodge home is big enough for all of us to enjoy and share the privileges of membership, regardless of where we choose to sit. Don't let that choice divide or define us. After all, we are still all Moose.

EDITOR'S NOTES

Two points of interest have become evident concerning the newsletter in a somewhat indirect manner. We have received several complaints about the September newsletter not being available on the website. This is a website issue. At this time, the website is managed by a contractor and this will hopefully be resolved by the contractor for this month's newsletter.

That being said, there also have been questions about the availability of the newsletter on the Facebook page. This gives the opportunity to provide some additional information about the Facebook page (which is actually a group, and yes there is a difference – but for the purpose of this article we will use page).

First of all, at the beginning of each month the newsletter is distributed via email, posting to the website and posting to the Facebook page as well as limited physical copies mailed. The post to the Facebook page is two-fold. The post is done under the FILES tab and shows on the timeline of the page. Herein lies the issue with some not finding the post later in the month. In September there were over 1,000 posts, comments and reactions (Likes, etc.) on the primary Lodge page. Each one of these actions shifts the subject post to the top of the feed, which rearranges all of the others. This is the way Facebook works and there is nothing we can do to prevent it. There are options we have to keep certain things at the top of the page, but those are currently applied to other posts determined as critical. This is a very wordy way of saying that the optimal way of accessing the newsletter on the Facebook page is to select FILES and the current newsletter and entertainment schedule will be one of the top two selections.
