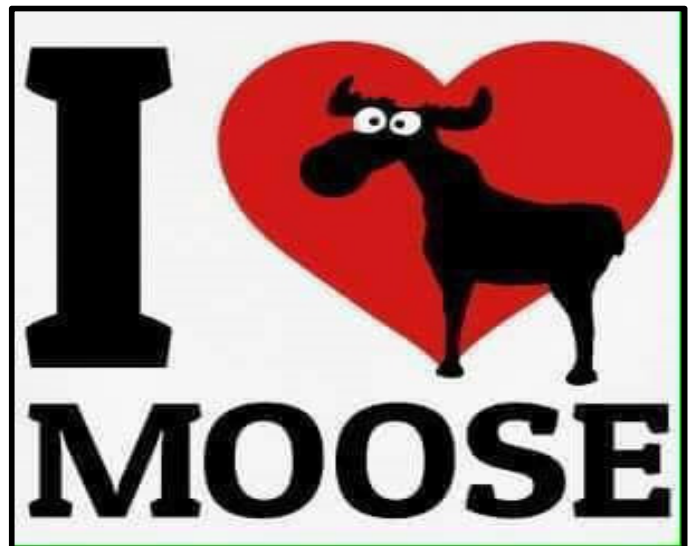
Moose Riders

SPECIAL EMPHASIS ON RETENTION

November 4-10 is our annual campaign to work on retaining members in all our fraternal units. Who should be helping to lead that effort one might ask? Well, you guessed it by now. The Council of Higher Degrees (CHD) core reason for existing is to assist in recovering and reactivating expired members – thus retaining them and preserving their individual member benefits.

We cannot have gains if we do not retain the bulk of the existing base. Often a simple friendly contact by another member is all that is needed to get the job done. Simply letting them know you care about them while pointing out their personal benefits and the good their membership does for others can often do the trick.

Contacting the original sponsor and getting them to reach out to the expired individual, we have found, can be especially successful. After all he or she convinced them to join to begin with. And for those first-and second-year renewals especially, the sponsor is getting more Member

Rewards Points too! They should help earn them by encouraging renewals. The councils can help with making phone calls and sending cards and letters.

Sometimes we hear the Lodge, Chapter or Moose Legion does not want to share their list because they don't want someone else sponsoring "their" members. Let's think logically about that. First we ought to be working on the recently-expired members. They are not eligible to be sponsored. However, the help from the CHD might get them paying dues in to your fraternal unit again. Wouldn't that be a good thing?

Our care of the children and seniors and our very future as a Fraternity depend upon efforts such as these. I talked with one CHD member who seemed to get a lot of results collecting expired dues. I asked how he did it. Simply, he knocks on doors. He takes a newsletter and other information with him and even carries a laptop so members can go on line to pay if they wish. He also carries a receipt book in case members wish to pay in cash. Personal contact is the bottom line that can get results.

Retention week is a short period of concentration that should kickoff the rest of the year's efforts. Remember it is a week-long focus (effort) but it should be a yearlong (round) commitment to our cause. Let's move our Moose mission onward and upward by striving and working to retain a greater number of members.

FACEBOOK PAGES

There continues to be questions and confusion about the Lodge Facebook pages. I have addressed this before, but will cover it again. There are two primary pages for the Lodge. Both are actually groups – one an open group; the other a closed group.

The main page, entitled MOOSE FAMILY CENTER 1655, FREDERICKSBURG VIRGINIA, is the open group and is primarily for posting Lodge events and functions. This group is visible to anyone, member or not, who has internet access. That is by design in order for us to be able to get information about our Lodge to both members and the general public. Because of the openness of this group, there are published rules regarding its use. They are available under the ABOUT tab on the page. Currently, this page requires approval for post because we have had too many post that were inappropriate for this function. We have two admins who monitor this page on a regular basis, but sometimes your post may not appear immediately, but it will get reviewed and if approved – posted within an hour of submission.

The other page is listed as MOOSE FAMILY CENTER #1655 – INTERNAL GROUP. This group was created due to posts/comments being entered on the open group that were, shall we say, “dirty laundry” – such as comments about smoking, gaming or other subjects that simply should not be made to non-members but we felt that a forum for such items would still be beneficial. This page does not require approval for post but totally inappropriate remarks, such as foul language, personal attacks or discussion of actual Lodge business (i.e. – repeating something that should only discussed or has been stated in Lodge meetings) will be deleted.

The difference between the usages of these two pages seems to lie in the users’ knowledge of the purpose of each, thus this article. The posting of things that should be internal on the open group has ended almost completely since making the internal group available. On the other hand, many posts – such as pictures of events and notices of upcoming events – have been made on internal group. That is fine and understandable because some folks only view the internal group, if they are also on the open group

also. The easiest way to do this is make those posts on the open group and then share it to the internal group.

One final note on Facebook pages. There is a third option out there simply titled FREDERICKSBURG MOOSE LODGE. This is a commercial business page initiated by Facebook and has no affiliation with the Lodge although there are many Lodge members who have “liked” this page. Just one word to the wise on this one, click on the number of likes of the page and see what information about you is being shared.

If the need arises to make a correction or change to the calendar hung by the shuffleboard, please contact Barbara Hudgins. She will usually have plenty of time to make whatever change is necessary in a timely manner. If it's an urgent change that must be done immediately, just scotch tape whatever the change may be to the metal frame. When such changes are affixed to the plastic it is extremely difficult to remove.

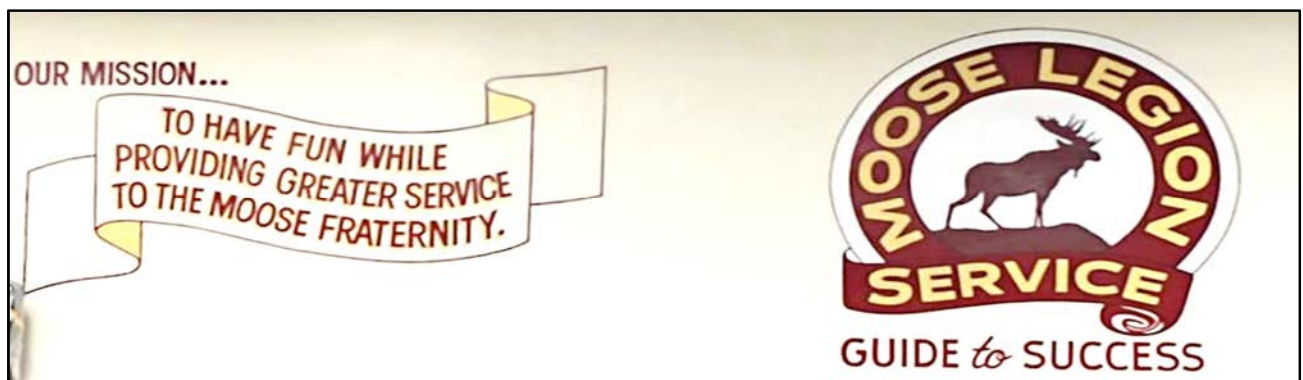
